When biking, make sure to have front (white) and rear (red) bike lights that flash, and wear/clip lights on umbrellas, backpacks, coats, strollers, and even your pets' collar or leash.

#### Be Aware:

Always be aware of your surroundings and watch to make sure that cars see you before you proceed.

## AIRPORT CONNECTOR ENDS

### Low ridership sited

A one year pilot project to provide transit service to and from the Eugene Airport and Lane Aviation Academy will end upon completion of the pilot period Nov. 30, 2016. The agencies partnering on this project - the City of Eugene (Eugene Airport), Lane Community College and LTD - all concur that ridership unfortunately is not substantial enough to warrant the cost of operation.

The Airport Connector service carried an average of 35 passengers each week beginning last December and cost \$100,000 to operate for twelve months. The Eugene-Springfield area is a much smaller community than where airport shuttle service typically runs successfully, in metropolitan areas with populations above 500,000.

We thank the riders and community members who made use of the service during this trial period.
