
WEST EUGENE EMX

This is the year!

Construction season doesn't officially kick off until warmer temperatures move into the Willamette Valley, but LTD isn't waiting for the calendar to get things started. Beginning in early January, EmX construction crews plan to install traffic signal improvements at the intersections of West 11th Avenue and Oak Patch Road and Garfield Street. Then, from February through June, crews aim to complete road and sidewalk construction between Tyinn and Garfield Streets. Most work restricting more than a single eastbound and/or westbound lane on 11th Avenue will be done during nighttime hours, 7 p.m.-6 a.m. If you'd like to learn more, you can sign up for project updates at LTD.org

The ice storm

The ice storm right before the December holidays proved to be a good test for Lane Transit District. But this was a test like no other because of the freeze. While the roads themselves were dry enough to handle the buses, the branches and downed power lines provided many challenges. Bus operators would call in from their routes in the morning indicating all was clear. Just an hour later, driving the route again, debris from fallen limbs and branches, or worse, downed power lines, blocked roadways, causing hazardous driving conditions.

Director of Operations, Jake McCallum called the storm, "A different kind of animal," because of the freeze. Detours were daily and changing often. The communications team worked through the weekend to ensure the proper messages were getting to bus riders, dependent on LTD to get to their jobs or holiday shopping. Surprisingly, only one accident could be blamed on the storm and that was the first night, Wednesday, December 14, when a tree limb dropped onto the top of an LTD bus, traveling in the River Road area of Eugene. Fortunately, everyone was safe, but the bus suffered some cosmetic damage.

What we're celebrating!

2016 was quite a year. Despite many on social media calling 2016 the "worst year ever," LTD sees many things for us and our customers to be happy about. Here's our list of things we're celebrating as we head into 2017:

Better transit service:

In 2016, LTD's Board of Directors approved a \$1 million investment in better bus service, leading to 15 minute frequencies on several routes, added trips on other routes, and expanded weekend and evening service.

· New buses ordered:

Riders can look forward to riding on 15 brand new buses, set to begin arriving in January. The new buses, including 10 all-electric buses, will replace some of the oldest buses in our fleet and will offer USB charging points for your mobile devices.

More federal funding:

2016 was the first year of a five-year transportation bill that our own Congressman, Peter DeFazio, helped write. The bill has more money to help transit agencies like LTD replace old buses and to keep our current buses in good condition.

• West Eugene EmX:

Starting in September 2016, the West Eugene EmX will open, providing better, faster transit service to people who live, work, and shop in West Eugene. For those who don't ride the bus, new bike and pedestrian bridges will connect West Eugene neighborhoods to the shops on West 11th Ave. and motorists can already enjoy a freshly re-paved roadway along most the corridor. Best of all, all that pesky construction will finally wrap up this coming summer.

Mill Race Bike Path's new paved section

Springfield will be celebrating in the New Year. Springfield, Willamalane, Springfield Utility Board and Springfield School District officials will gather on Thursday, January 19, (10:30 a.m. to 12 noon) to officially open the new 3 mile paved section of the Mill Race bike path. The new section means the bike path links downtown Springfield to the Middle Fork Path. The path extension will allow bicyclists, walkers and joggers the opportunity to travel from Downtown Springfield to the Thurston area on dedicated routes.

The western terminus is at the Booth-Kelley complex (The Booth-Kelly Trailhead), right behind the Springfield Station, which is where the ribbon cutting will take place.

For bike riders, this new addition opens up a multitude of possibilities linking the EmX and East Springfield for bike commuters.
