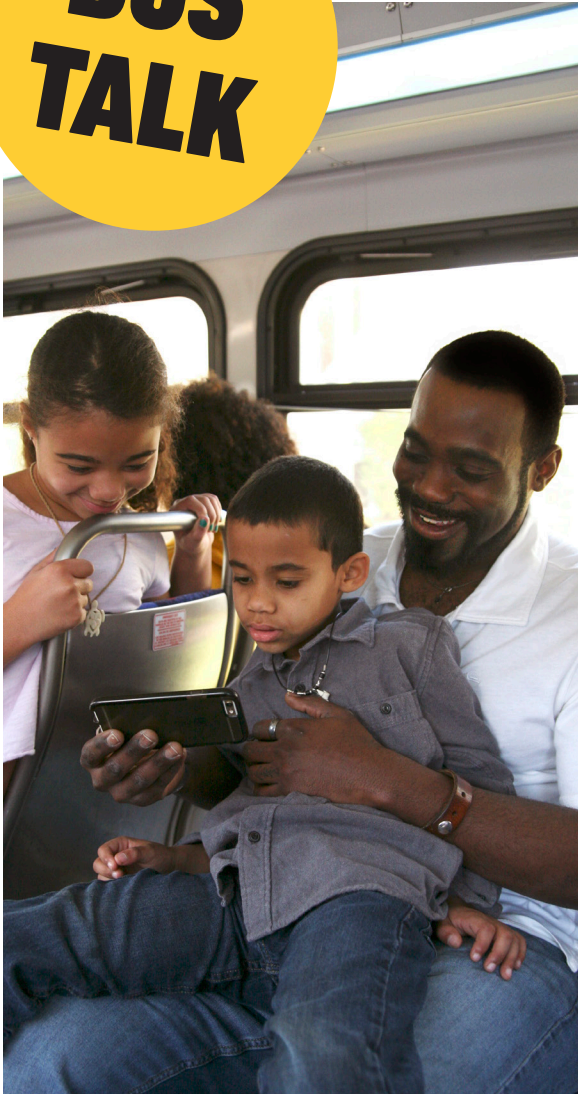

To receive an Honored Rider pass, fill out a short application and present proof of age and photo identification. LTD's Customer Service Center issues the cards at the downtown Eugene Station, open weekdays 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. There is a \$3.00 processing fee to receive the photo ID card, which entitles the rider to ride LTD for free for five years. # CHANGES COMING TO MCVAY EMX STATION

## Glenwood construction affects service

Due to the Franklin Boulevard Redevelopment Project, there will be some service interruptions at the McVay Station, which is currently located at the confluence of Franklin Boulevard and Old Franklin Boulevard. These will begin in April and include temporary electrical issues affecting lighting and fare machines. The McVay Station will be permanently closed beginning June 1 until the project is finished, with a new EmX stop to be located at a site to be determined later.

If you are a regular inbound rider of the EmX, you will be able to avoid the McVay Station by utilizing the Lexington Station instead. For those customers that are located south of Franklin Boulevard, the option is to take the route 85 bus into the Springfield Station and transfer to EmX there.

LTD is proud to partner with the City of Springfield on this project. We thank the public and our riders for their patience with these changes. Once the project is finished, the improvements will allow for better mobility along Franklin Boulevard for those in cars, on the bus, on bicycles, and on foot.

# WEST EUGENE SERVICE REDESIGN

## Community input key



After three months of robust community outreach, the West Eugene Service Redesign proposal, enhancing the service of 14 routes serving the West Eugene area, was presented to the LTD Board of Directors March 15 at Churchill High School. This followed community outreach to 23 groups and organizations throughout LTD's service area by LTD staff, on-board surveys, and an on-line survey taken by more than 620 riders and community members. The outreach began in January and wrapped up with a public hearing last month. The LTD Board is now completing consideration of the feedback and proposed service changes before adopting the service plan at its April 15 meeting. Staff will then go to work on preparing implementation of the new service.

The redesign of routing in West Eugene takes effect September 17, 2017 with the opening of EmX service.
