BIG JULY EVENTS

Oregon Country Fair and Butte to Butte

LTD will provide free service to those participating in the Butte-to-Butte race and the Oregon Country Fair, courtesy of the Oregon Track Club and the Oregon Country Fair respectively.

Free fare only applies to people attending these specific events. Anyone riding the bus on these dates who is not attending these specific events should plan to use their regular bus pass or pay the usual fare.

For the Butte-to-Butte race, the free service is for event participants traveling from the downtown Eugene pick-up locations (at 5th & Pearl and 4th & Mill) to the beginning of the race (at Donald and 40th), 6:30 a.m. – 8:00 a.m. on July 4. Routes 970X/971X

For the Oregon Country Fair, event goers simply need to show their OCF ticket to ride LTD free on July 7, 8, & 9. Routes 988X/989X

WEST EUGENE SERVICE REDESIGN

Increased service

Earlier this year, LTD asked riders and community members for their input on service in west Eugene. Information was gathered through a series of outreach activities, including 22 presentations and a survey resulting in overwhelmingly positive feedback for transit service that increases connectivity and provides more travel options and better frequency. LTD's service plan for west Eugene integrates the new EmX West service with 10 bus routes. The service plan, adopted by the LTD Board of Directors in April, represents a significant and exciting service enhancement for our community. The following 11 routes will be affected by service changes beginning September 17:
