One-seat service

Major enhancements to the community's transit service begin next month. On September 17, the third line of the community's Bus Rapid Transit system, known as EmX, will begin operation and provide one-seat service between west Eugene, downtown Eugene, the UO, Springfield and the RiverBend-Gateway area. Changes to LTD's bus routes in west Eugene will also take place, providing greater connectivity, less downtown transfers and more options for riders to get where they want to go.

LTD staff will be out and about in the community between now and mid-September educating riders and encouraging others interested in using transit to give it a try. Here are some of the locations:

EMX IMPROVEMENTS

Enhancements in west Eugene

The results of much hard work now completed along the five mile stretch of the new west Eugene EmX line will benefit riders as well as pedestrians, cyclists and motorists. Enhancements include:

- Improved intersections with two new signalized pedestrian crossings
- 26 new bus shelters
- 3 bike bridges for improved access to West 11th
- 200 more trees planted
- 26 water filtration systems for storm water run off
- Improved street lighting for safety
- 5 miles of rebuilt and new sidewalks
- Curb cut-outs at crosswalks to safely accommodate mobility devices

Walk and bike to school

It's August and a new school year is just around the corner. As families prepare for the start of school, LTD's Point2Point and the Eugene-Springfield Safe Routes to School programs encourage kids and families to consider walking and biking to school. Why?

- Children and adolescents who get one hour or more of physical activity each day are healthier. And students who are active before arriving to the classroom are more settled and ready to focus on learning.
- Walking and biking saves money. Families with incomes under \$50,000 per year spend an average of 30 percent of their budget on transportation. Active transportation can cut fuel costs and reduce normal automobile wear and tear.
- Choosing walking and biking over driving reduces greenhouse gas emissions and keeps the air we breathe cleaner. In Oregon, 38 percent of CO2 emissions stem from transportation, primarily from cars and trucks.

Want to help increase the number of students walking and biking to school? The Safe Routes to School program is looking for parent volunteers to lead walking school buses and to help organize walk and bike encouragement events in their school communities.

Total solar eclipse

Monday, August 21 10:15 a.m.

The last total solar eclipse to be viewed in Oregon was in 1979. This year, our area will be lucky enough to experience this celestial wonder once again when the moon passes in front of the sun and, for a brief time, there is complete darkness. The Eugene-Springfield area is just south of the path of the eclipse, and will experience 99.3% darkness around 10:15 a.m. You can get special glasses to safely view the eclipse at The Science Factory for \$1.50 and the Eugene, Cascades & Coast Visitor Center for \$2.

Tourists from all over will be passing through our region to see the eclipse. Please be prepared for increased traffic and congestion around the days leading up to and following this event. You can avoid the heavy tourist traffic by riding the bus instead of driving.
