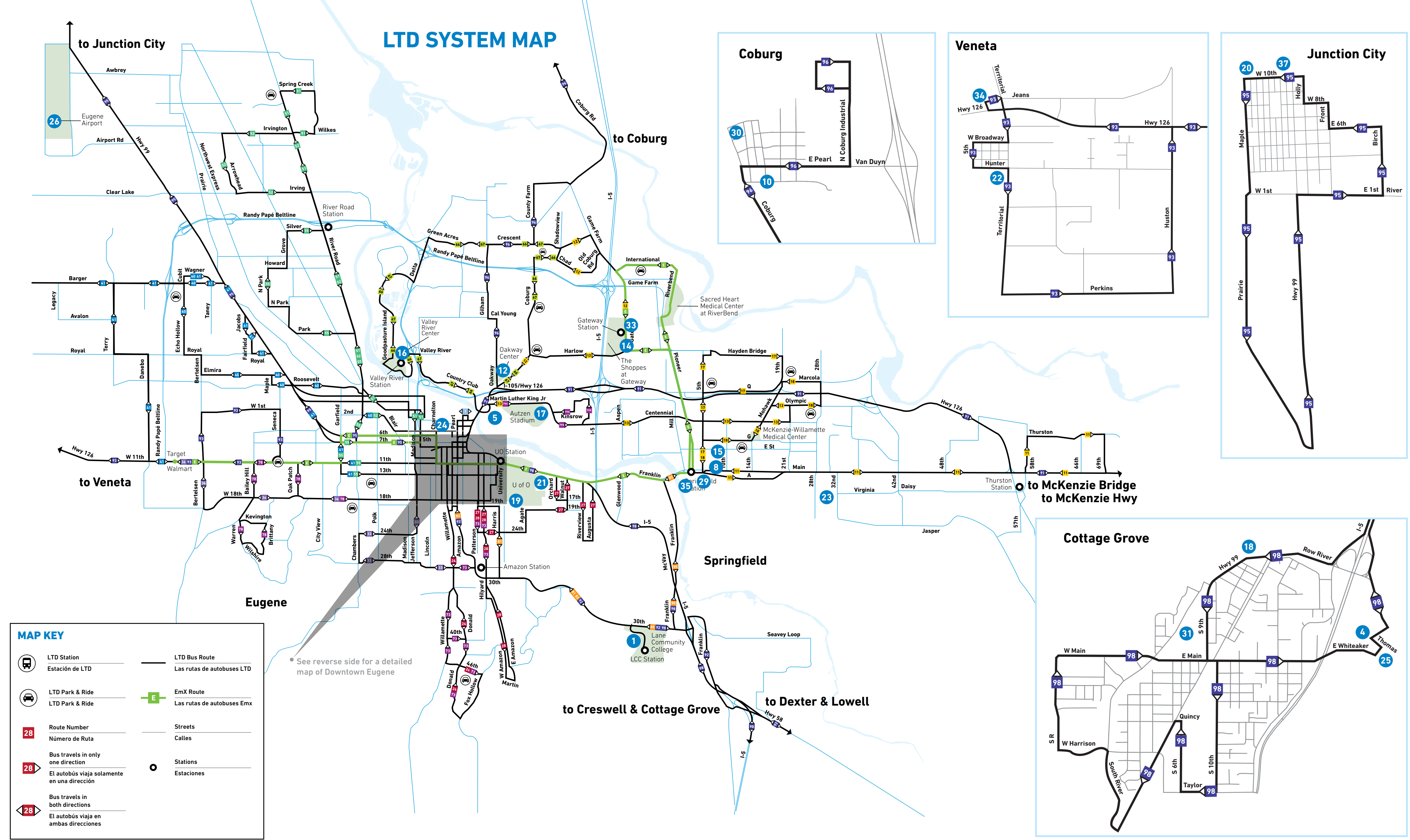

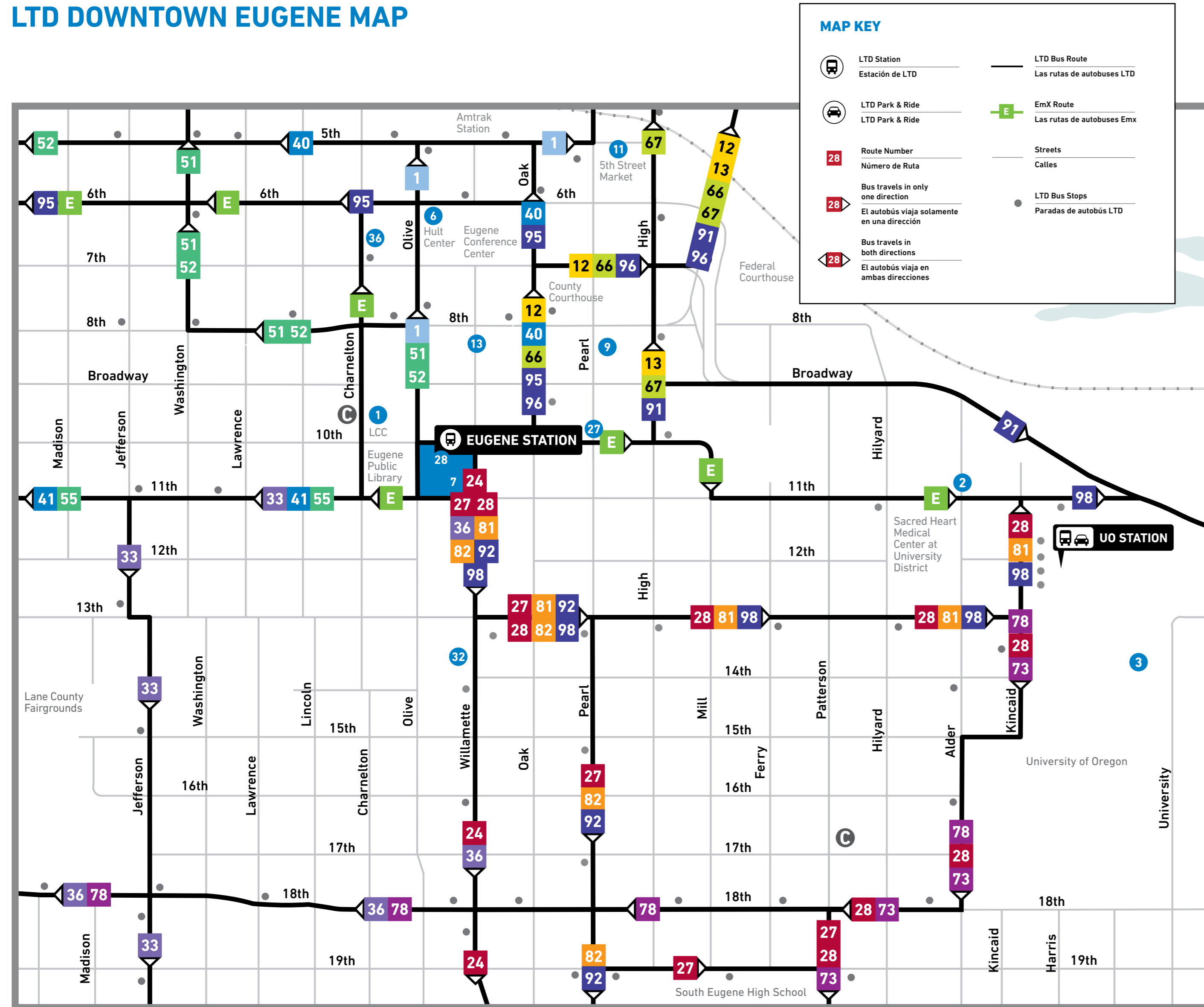

LANE TRANSIT DISTRICT SERVICE

LTD provides more than 10 million trips per year on its buses and EmX Bus Rapid Transit line in Lane County, Oregon. Encompassing the Eugene-Springfield metro area, LTD is a special district of the state of Oregon.

LTD also operates RideSource, a paratransit service for people with disabilities, and Point2point, a transportation options programs to promote sustainable travel throughout the region.

New EmX Service

The newest segment of Eugene-Springfield's bus rapid transit service, **EmX** in West Eugene is now in operation. This milestone follows years of study, design, planning and public input. It is the third segment of the region's popular, easy-to-use system that supports multi-modal travel in key corridors. The new **EmX** line travels on

West 6th, 7th, and 11th avenues, as well as Garfield and Charnelton streets and connects to two existing **EmX** lines traveling between downtown Eugene, downtown Springfield, and the Gateway area.

- 26 new **EmX** stations with boarding platforms.
- 3 new signalized pedestrian crossings.
- New sidewalks along W. 11th Ave.
- 2 new bicycle/pedestrian bridges (Buck St. & Wallis St.).
- 10-minute frequency along W. 11th Ave. corridor from Beltline Hwy to Garfield St.
- Real-time transit information at each **EmX** bus station
- Tickets purchased at each station.
- Newly landscaped curbs.

Rider Tips

- Have exact change; bus operators cannot make change.
- No refunds or exchanges can be given.
- Riders 65 and older ride free – Pick up an Honored Rider bus pass at the Customer Service Center at the Eugene station.
- Half-fare: Children 18 and younger and those with disabilities.
- **EmX** tickets are sold at ticket vending machines at **EmX** stations; **EmX** tickets can be exchanged for a day pass when switching to regular fixed route LTD buses. All regular LTD passes are accepted on **EmX**.
- 1-Month passes, 3-Month passes and 10-Ride Ticket Books are available for purchase at LTD.org.

TAKE YOUR BIKE ON THE BUS!



The Eugene-Springfield area has more than 100 miles of paths, on-street bike lanes and designated bike routes, making pedaling a great travel option. The 12-mile Ruth Bascom Riverbank Path System travels on both sides of the beautiful Willamette River and connects with numerous other paths. With the addition of the Buck St. and Wallis St. bike bridges, W. 11th St. will offer more destination opportunities.

Bike/Bus Rider Tips

All **REGULAR BUSES** have bike racks on the **FRONT** of the bus; **EmX** buses have bike racks **INSIDE** the bus.

Regular Buses

1. Squeeze the release handle to pull the rack down.
2. Lift bike onto the bike rack, placing the front wheel in the labeled slot.
3. Raise the support arm up and over the front tire.
4. When exiting the bus, use the front door, to communicate with the bus driver that you will be removing your bike.

EmX Buses

1. Enter through rear door.
2. Place bike in bike rack and secure with fastening straps.
3. Stand or sit near your bike.
4. Exit through rear door.
