EMX HONORED



Oregon's Project of the Year

LTD and its partners collaborated on a construction project ten years in the making to bring public transportation and corridor enhancements to west Eugene. The EmX West project recently received the top honor in the state of Oregon by the American Public Works Association in the large project catagory.

"Our partners were instrumental in getting this project finished on time and on budget," said Joe McCormack, LTD's Director of Facilities.

The project added nine miles of Bus Rapid Transit service (round trip), six miles of road improvements, five miles of new or rebuilt sidewalks, two bike-ped bridges, 187 ADA corners, 35 water filtration planters, two pedestrian crosswalks, public art and corridor beautification improvements, lighting and other safety features.

The project was evaluated on such criteria as whether the project meets the needs of the community, creative ways of overcoming economic challenges, construction that minimizes impacts to the community and environmental preservation strategies. The EmX West project will next be reviewed and compared to other substantial public works projects from across the country.

LTD recognizes and thanks its great project partners: the City of Eugene, EWEB, Lane County, the Federal Transit Administration and the ODOT.

EMX IN WEST EUGENE

Getting more people to more places

October 17 marked the one-month anniversary of the launch of the West Eugene EmX service. If you travel along the new EmX route, you'll see many people at EmX stations and on EmX buses and more walkers and bicyclists in West Eugene.

Within the first month of operation, 80,000 rides have been taken on the new line, with an average of 3,000 boardings each weekday (less on the weekends). EmX West is the third line of the region's award-winning Bus Rapid Transit system, which acts as the backbone to LTD's system and connects people to services, employment and recreation.

- 16.513 non drive-alone trips reported
- 218,809 less vehicle miles traveled
- 7,980 gallons of gasoline saved, retaining \$21,945 in our local economy
- 157,181 pounds of CO2 eliminated

- 876,477 less vehicle miles traveled
- 30,999 gallons of gasoline saved
- 602,112 pounds of CO2 eliminated
