

## **MOVING AHEAD**

#### Where are we now

Ever wonder what the region will look like in the future? Or if our roadways will see more congestion, like other growing cities are? Or what kind of transit service will be available to get you around town?

The City of Eugene is expecting over 34,000 more people and 37,000 more jobs within the next 15 years. The City is planning for this growth through MovingAhead, a joint transportation project between the City of Eugene and LTD. Over the past several months, the public and transit riders were asked for input on how they would like to see people move across the city in the future.

An online survey along with four open house meetings were held in the key neighborhoods where some of our busiest streets are: Coburg Road, MLK, Jr. Boulevard, Highway 99, River Road and 30th Avenue (downtown Eugene to LCC). A variety of listening sessions were also held. The MovingAhead project team received helpful feedback that will help define how these streets are developed in the future.

The MovingAhead project is focused on creating better connections for people to get to jobs, school, shopping, recreation, and other activities by considering a wide range of transportation options along these five key corridors.

Some of the infrastructure additions under consideration include wider sidewalks, signalized pedestrian crossings, protected bike lanes as well as improved bus service, which may include adding an EmX bus rapid transit line.

Based on recent input from our community, several transit option 'packages' are being developed. Another round of rider and public engagement will occur next spring to further define what is best for the community.
