TRANSIT TOMORROW

Potential Service Scenarios

Transit Tomorrow is Lane Transit District's (LTD) effort to find out how we can better move the people we serve by taking a comprehensive look at current service and operations. Last summer LTD sought input on what types of public transit service the community valued and where LTD should prioritize resources.

Based on public input from Phase 1, four scenarios for future transit were developed for the community:

- Provide more frequent public transit along major corridors,
- Provide service to a broader area of the community,
- Lower fares for everyone, or
- Provide more service on weekends and evenings

LTD is now seeking additional input from the community based on the information in the *Scenarios Report. As a part of Phase 2, a new survey began in mid-January and will continue through February 28. Feedback from Phase 2 will help LTD further define what transit service will look like in the future.

RIDER TIPS!

Please Be Courteous

During peak commute times, buses can become standing room only. When this happens here are a few tips on how to be a courteous rider.

- When choosing a seat, please take a window seat and place personal items in your lap rather than in the empty seat next to you. This provides more seating and easy access for other riders who are boarding.
- If holding onto a stability pole, please refrain from wrapping your arms around it. This prevents other riders from having access to the pole.
- If you are a taller person and need to stand, please use the pole that runs horizontally across the ceiling. This allows shorter riders access to the vertical poles.
- Please remove large backpacks and hold in front of you. This allows more room for people to board and keeps from crowding other riders.
- On the EmX, please allow room for bike riders to safely secure their bike in the bike bay.

Courteous riders make the trip better for all.
