
## Be Seen at Your Stop

**Lane Transit District** 

Mark your calendars: Daylight Savings ends on Sunday, November 7. As the daylight starts fading earlier and the weather shifts to fall-like conditions, it can be difficult for bus operators to see you waiting at your stop. Visit the Customer Service Center at Eugene Station or ask your operator for a free pedestrian or clip-on bike light, while supplies last. Be safe and help our bus operators and other drivers see you when it is dark, foggy, or raining by following these tips:

- Stand up as the bus approaches your stop.
- Use a cell phone or light to signal the bus operator.
- Wear light-colored, bright, or reflective clothing.
- When walking, face oncoming traffic.





## **UO Students and Staff: Get on Board with Umo**

Download the Umo Mobility app or get a tap card from the UO Transportation Services office to continue riding the bus for free. 
#### Stuff the Bus to Help Local Families A community tradition is upon us once again. For the 26th year, the Stuff the Bus event is collecting donations of
