always been part of the solution to climate change, and we need your support. Help us meet our climate goals by choosing transit, walking, rolling and biking.



Redistricting **Process**

Every ten years when federal population census data is updated, Lane Transit District's seven subdistrict boundaries must be adjusted to reflect any changes. LTD has launched a public process in accordance with the guidelines set by the Secretary of State to establish new boundaries that ensure each subdistrict:

- Is contiguous. Is of equal population.
- Utilizes existing geographic or political boundaries.
- Does not divide communities of interest.
- Is connected by transportation links. Is consistent with the diversity, equity and inclusion and accessibility values of the Secretary of State, as

MovingAhead: Preferred **Alternatives Approved**

The Eugene City Council and LTD Board of Directors

approved the Locally Preferred Alternatives for

MovingAhead, a partnership between the City of Eugene and Lane Transit District (LTD) to improve transportation options and increase safety along five key corridors. After more than 20 open houses/workshops, emails to more than 1,000 accounts, 60 presentations/community events, 46,000 mailings, and canvassing 500 properties along the corridors, the following Preferred Alternatives were approved: • Highway 99 - Enhanced Corridor River Road – EmX



- Martin Luther King, Jr. Boulevard via downtown Enhanced Corridor Coburg Road – Enhanced Corridor*
- 30th Avenue to Lane Community College (LCC) via downtown No Build *Requires additional study and community engagement
- engagement, so that staff can continue to work towards implementing investments along these important streets.






