Students Reduce their Carbon Footprint

LTD invited high school students from Bethel School District, Springfield Public Schools, and Eugene School District 4J to crush CO2 and compete with local high schools in the first-ever "Take the Bus Challenge." 17,793 trips were taken on the LTD bus using the Student Transit Pass from November 7-20. The school with the highest participation, as well as individual students,

were recognized for their commitment to sustainability and reducing their carbon footprint. Congratulations to all of the winners!

All K-12 students in public, private, and home schools across Lane County are eligible for the Student Transit Pass. Students can visit their school office to

receive their Student Transit Pass, allowing them to ride the LTD bus to school, work, and activities for free.

LTD Welcomes New CEO

Jameson T. Auten, Lane Transit District's (LTD) new Chief Executive Officer, officially began his tenure with the District on November 7, 2022. He comes to the District from the Kansas City Area Transportation Authority (KCATA), where he served as the agency's Deputy CEO/Chief Operating Officer.



"Lane Transit District is highly respected nationally," Auten said. "I am pleased to join and lead the LTD team and I look forward to working with our communities to deliver customer-centric services that provide community value and are developed with community input. Our mission is to connect our communities in a fiscally responsible, environmentally sustainable, equitable, and transparent manner."

A 20-year career vet, Auten has held a variety of key leadership positions with KCATA and with the Greater Richmond Transit System (GRTC). He also serves on the Board of Directors for the American Public Transportation Association (APTA) in addition to serving in a voluntary role with the National Academies of Sciences.

He replaced Mark Johnson, who has served as LTD's Interim General Manager since August 2021, when Aurora (AJ) Jackson resigned from the District's top spot to accept a position in the private sector. Johnson will continue with LTD through Auten's transition.

Free Rides to Egan Warming Centers

When Egan Warming Centers are open, LTD offers free transportation to those in need of a warm shelter. To receive a free ride to an Egan Warming Center, talk to a bus operator. Egan Warming Centers are a service offered by St. Vincent de Paul Society of Lane County and operate when overnight temperatures are forecasted to dip below freezing from Nov. 15 to Mar. 31. Local media outlets will be alerted when the service is open and pass the information to the community.

Be Prepared

It's time to get prepared for winter weather before it arrives. Here are three ways you can prepare right now for potential snow and ice incidents:

- Go to LTD.org, click on the routes you use and see if there is a blue snowflake symbol displayed on the route. This indicates that on snow or ice days, your route could be delayed or detoured. Plan ahead when snow is forecasted and expect delays.
- Follow LTD on Twitter (@LaneTransit). The LTD website Service Alerts page and Twitter will be updated regularly, and local news sources will be kept informed as well.
- Prepare a grab-and-go bag of snowy day essentials, such as a hat, scarf, gloves, a clip-on light to keep your hands free, and spare socks.
